Show me signs!

My mother-in-law was Image Manager for Disneyland Resort and Disneyland International where she managed the education and communication of the Disney Look for 11,000 cast members. She knows something about image creating. She often used to say, "First impressions are so important. They decide 75 percent of long-term relationships." Much scientific research backs up that theory. The human brain's ability to reach conclusions based on just a momentary exposure to someone is known by experts as "thin slicing." Author and journalist, Malcolm Gladwell, wrote in *Blink:* The Power of Thinking Without Thinking (43-44): "Thin-slicing is not an exotic gift. It is a central part of what it means to be human. We thin-slice whenever we meet a new person or have to make sense of something quickly or encounter a novel situation."

I now wonder what your first impression of me and my family were. How did you slice me in the novel situation (aka, meeting a new pastor)? I am an introvert and even shy. Did you catch that? I don't display myself well, but I am quietly stubborn. Did you read that too? I know I need to work on creating better first impressions or images to show who I am. I need to put better signs on my forehead.

Now, let me tell you what my first impressions of you were. My first impression of GUMC was there are great people in the church doing great ministries. You are thoughtful, kind, and loving. You do great ministries in worship, education, mission, fellowship, and service. I know many churches and have been in ministry a long time. GUMC lacks one important thing for a good first impression: outdoor signs. Signs create first impressions of the people and the place, collectively, "the church." We need to understand human "thin-slicing" to reach out to new people. We need better and bigger signs to impress upon people who we are when people walk by or drive by our church.

Jesus performed miracles and people called them "signs." His healing miracles displayed his compassion for the sick. His feeding miracles displayed his mercy for the hungry. Yes, his miracles were signs showing who he was rather than what he did. Many people didn't understand his miracles—his signs. They were stuck on what he did, but Jesus wanted to show them who he was through his signs. How about us? Are we willing to show who we are through our signs? What signs do we need to show our welcome and love for all people of God? I want to work on it with you—putting out signs!

Let me know what you think about that!




NEW BIBLE STUDY ANNOUNCED!






