New Adult Bible study – Apocrypha

Do you know there are more books in other Bibles than we have in our protestant Bible? Our Bible does not contain all the literature that has come down to us from ancient Israel. In fact, the books of the Old Testament only represent a portion of the vast library of ancient Jewish texts that were in circulation at the time of Jesus. We call them intertestamental Apocrypha. What are they and why don't we have them in our Bible? When were those books written and for whom? Are those books important for us, protestant Methodists? Much of the literature was written right before Jesus' time in between the Old Testament and the New Testament and they help us understand the religious backgrounds of the time when Jesus came.

Glenview UMC's Adults Bible Study groups will meet Wednesday morning and Sunday morning starting on the first week after Labor Day. We will study Apocrypha. Invite your Catholic friends to the study. The official Catholic Bible contains eighteen of those books. They also might enjoy this study. The study books are in the office, \$10 per copy.

Each fall before school starts, all the fall high school coaches and athletes come together for the start of their seasons. At the end of tryouts, the coaches will make some players really happy and others, well, coaches will crush their spirits. It is the worst part of coaching. It is not intentional. It is just that we always have more players tryout than spots available on the teams. Players frequently ask, other than their skills, what they can do to stand out, to make a difference. I tell them to physically give all they can at each tryout session. And that is important. But coaches are also looking for more than that. This year one young player shared that she wanted to make the highest level possible and asked me what she could do to make herself stand above the rest. I shared: Be the first one in the gym and the last one to leave. Just don't help set up equipment and put it away, be the person who leads others to do it. Take care of others on the team - be sure everyone has a partner and no feels left out.

So Greg and I were thinking, what if the goal of our youth was to be on the "Varsity Jesus Team?" What would we tell our youth about what they needed to do to stand out? Attendance is mandatory unless there were extenuating emergency circumstances. Be the first to come to church and the last to leave. Don't just participate in worship services and Sunday School and GUMY, be a leader in worship, Sunday School and GUMY activities. Be the person who not only shows up but makes sure everyone is included. Be the person who makes sure no one feels left out. Doesn't this sound similar to what John Wesley said? "Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the places you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can, as long as ever you can." It is what being a Methodist is about. And as much as we may try, we all fall short. I know I do. Good thing there is forgiveness and grace or we may all be "cut" from the team at some point in our life. But I can't help but think, what if we approached being a Christian like we do making the team or getting first chair in band or orchestra or getting the lead part in a play. What if?


