You can bake cookies, bars, cakes, cupcakes, etc. or even something like trail mix. You can bring it to the church kitchen labeled and packaged for selling (i.e. 6 to a dozen for cookies, etc.) on Friday, May 13<sup>th</sup>.

#### WE ARE AGAIN HAVING A DIAPER DRIVE!

In low income households, babies often spend the entire day or longer in a single diaper, because the family cannot afford to buy an adequate supply of diapers. Low income parents cannot take advantage of free or subsidized child care if they cannot afford to leave disposable diapers at the childcare centers. An unfortunate consequence of an inadequate supply of diapers is work and school truancy among the caregivers. A baby crying from being in a soiled diaper for a prolonged period of time may be at a greater risk of physical abuse by the caregiver, as recognized in studies of patterns of abuse among low income families. Please show your "hearts for children" by dropping off any size diaper or wipes (no adult diapers please) (even opened packages) to the church collection bins now through May 15<sup>th</sup>.
