#### WE ARE AGAIN HAVING A DIAPER DRIVE!

In low income households, babies often spend the entire day or longer in a single diaper, because the family cannot afford to buy an adequate supply of diapers. Low income parents cannot take advantage of free or subsidized child care if they cannot afford to leave disposable diapers at the childcare centers. An unfortunate consequence of an inadequate supply of diapers is work and school truancy among the caregivers. A baby crying from being in a soiled diaper for a prolonged period of time may be at a greater risk of physical abuse by the caregiver, as recognized in studies of patterns of abuse among low income families. Please show your "hearts for children" by dropping off any size diaper or wipes (no adult diapers please) (even opened packages) to the church collection bins now through May 15<sup>th</sup>.

# A SERVICE OF WORD AND TABLE II

A congregation may use this text beginning with the invitation to the Lord's table. Preceding parts of the service are guided by a bulletin or by announcement.

The people gather in the Lord's name.
They offer prayer and praise.
The Scriptures are read and preached.
Responses of praise, faith, and prayer are offered.
The service continues with the invitation to the Lord's table.

## INVITATION

Christ our Lord invites to his table all who love him, who earnestly repent of their sin and seek to live in peace with one another.

Therefore, let us confess our sin before God and one another.

in the strength of your Spirit, to give ourselves for others, that

# CONFESSION AND PARDON

Merciful God,
we confess that we have not loved you with our whole heart.
We have failed to be an obedient church.
We have not done your will,
we have broken your law,
we have rebelled against your love,
we have not loved our neighbors,
and we have not heard the cry of the needy.
Forgive us, we pray.
Free us for joyful obedience,
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

All pray in silence.

Leader to people:

Hear the good news:

Christ died for us while we were yet sinners;
that proves God's love toward us.

In the name of Jesus Christ, you are forgiven!

People to leader:

In the name of Jesus Christ, you are forgiven.

Leader and people:

Glory to God. Amen.

## THE PEACE

Let us offer one another signs of reconciliation and love.

All exchange signs and words of God's peace.

#### **OFFERING**

As forgiven and reconciled people, let us offer ourselves and our gifts to God.

A hymn, psalm, or anthem may be sung as the offering is received.

The bread and wine are brought by representatives of the people to the Lord's table with the other gifts, or uncovered if already in place.

A hymn, doxology, or other response may be sung as the gifts are presented.

### TAKING THE BREAD AND CUP

The pastor takes the bread and cup, and the bread and wine are prepared for the meal.

## THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

One of the musical settings on pages 17-25 may be used if desired.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.\*

with your people on earth and all the company of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

# 14 WORD AND TABLE: SERVICE II

On the night in which he gave himself up for us he took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said:
"Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you.
Do this in remembrance of me."

When the supper was over, he took the cup,
gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said:
"Drink from this, all of you;
this is my blood of the new covenant,
poured out for you and for many
for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this as often as you drink it

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

And so,
in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ,
we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving

By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world, until Christ comes in final victory, and we feast at his heavenly banquet.

Through your Son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your holy church, all honor and glory is yours, almighty Father, now and for ever.

#### BREAKING THE BREAD

# CSGIVING THE BREAD AND GURNNER

The body of Christ, given for you. Amen. The blood of Christ, given for you. Amen.

The congregation sings hymns while the bread and cup are given.

When all have received, the Lord's table is put in order.

The pastor or congregation may then give thanks after Communion.
