People: We lift them up to the Lord.


Leader: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **People:** It is right to give our thanks and praise.

The 2022 Glenbrook CROP Hunger Walk to Fight World Hunger through Church World Service (CWS) will be held at Northfield Community Church, 400 Wagner Road, Northfield on **OCTOBER 16<sup>th</sup>**. Meet 12-12:30, Walk starts at 1 pm. CWS provides food, medical care, disaster relief, water wells in remote areas and self-help development for people in need, locally and around the world. 25% of the money raised by the Glenbrook Crop Hunger Walk will be donated to local agencies.
