The 2022 Glenbrook CROP Hunger Walk to Fight World Hunger through Church World Service (CWS) will be held at Northfield Community Church, 400 Wagner Road, Northfield on **OCTOBER 16th**. CWS provides food, medical care, disaster relief, water wells in remote areas and self-help development for people in need, locally and around the world. 25% of the money raised by the Glenbrook Crop Hunger Walk will be donated to local agencies.
