Migrant Assistance - Volunteers & Items Needed

Latest reports indicate that about 3,000 migrants have arrived so far on buses to the Chicago area from Texas and more continue to arrive almost daily. It's projected as many as 10,000 migrants could arrive in the Chicago area by the end of the calendar year. So, there continues to be a significant need to provide a welcome for those arriving.



"We primarily need volunteers right now to help with providing individuals and families transportation to various appointments (medical, legal, etc.)," said NIC Refugee Coordinator, Rev. Jonathan Crail. For anyone interested in volunteering, we encourage them to sign up as a volunteer as a first step, worldrelief.org/chicagoland and list "Bus Response" on their volunteer application in the Volunteer Interests field. Other volunteers are needed also.

World Relief needs hygiene kits while the agency has begun to provide direct services to some of the families and individuals arriving on the buses. Hygiene kits include a durable bag to hold items, shampoo, soap, toothbrushes & toothpaste, deodorant, disposable razors & shaving cream, feminine hygiene products, socks, basic first aid supplies and ibuprofen/acetomenaphin. 

in the offering plates during November and December will go to Curt's Café, located in Evanston and Highland Park. Curt's







Summary of the 2nd Church Discussion on Firearms Proliferation Sunday, October 23, 2022

On Sunday, October 23, 2022, 20 members of the Congregation gathered after Church to hold the 2nd meeting on reduction of firearms proliferation. The discussion reviewed "Our Call to Reduce Gun Violence", an "Official Church Statement" of the 2016 General Conference and additional items requested were added or clarified. To recap, the "Statement" calls for:

- Universal background checks on all gun purchases
- Ratification of the Arms Trade Treaty *
- Ensuring all guns are sold through licensed gun retailers
- Prohibiting all individuals convicted of violent crimes from purchasing a gun for a fixed time-period
- Prohibiting all individuals under restraining order due to threat of violence from purchasing a gun
- Prohibiting persons with serious mental illness, who pose a danger to themselves and their communities, from purchasing a gun
- Ensuring greater access to services for those suffering from mental illness
- Establishing a minimum age of 21 years for a gun purchase or possession
- Banning large-capacity ammunition magazines and weapons designed to fire multiple rounds each time the trigger is pulled
- Promoting new technologies to aid law-enforcement agencies to trace crime guns and promote public safety.
- * Need additional information on what the "Arms Trade Treaty" is.

In the last meeting it was agreed the following should be added to the above or clarified:

- Addressing the issues of peer pressure and organized violence, and
- Providing more education and intervention in support of violence prevention.

In this meeting there were three additional items of discussion:

- A summary of the status of the "Arms Trade Treaty" was provided and discussed. It was felt additional time was needed to review the provisions of the treaty in more detail. The goal of doing this was to better understand the ramifications of portions of the treaty on less powerful nations that possess fewer resources.
- It was agreed the following should be added to the "Statement", in addition to those above:

Providing more education and support towards the safe operation of and responsibility for firearms operation, and Embodying love, caring, and respect for people in need by working with them to help bridge gaps in opportunities and resources that are the result of historical and ongoing inequities and oppression.

There will be another discussion immediately after the service of Sunday, November 20, 2022. Please join us! We look forward to your thoughts and participation in the discussion of this issue that is of concern to many of our members!
