Wow... Advent is already around the corner. Many churches follow the common lectionary of the liturgical calendar which cycles every three years (year A, B, and C). If we follow the common lectionary which consists of four readings from both the Old and New Testaments each week, we finish reading or hearing seventy percent of the Bible in three years.

This year is common lectionary year A staring on the first Sunday of Advent, and we will follow it for three years in our worship, hymns, prayers, sermons, and the Bible study. During Advent, we will have a *devotion group* that meets on Thursdays starting on **December 1 at 7pm on zoom**. We will read *Upper Room* devotions at home every day and meet on Thursdays for communal candle lighting, prayer, and reflections. *Upper Room* copies are in the church office. Please contact me at echoi@glenviewumc.org to get a zoom link for the Thursday gatherings.

Consider preparing an Advent wreath at home. Use four blue or purple candles and one white candle for your personal/family Advent devotions. The families of children and youth will receive a daily devotion in your email from the directors of youth ministry, Beth and Greg Peterson. If you are not on their email list but want to receive family-oriented Advent devotions, please contact them at Petersons@glenviewumc.org.


