God of the priests and the prophets,


God of Mary and Joseph,

In the last months of Mozart's short life, he began work on his "Requiem". A Mass for the deceased, Mozart himself died before completing it. It was later finished by a student of his based on Mozart's sketches and some new material. Central to the Requiem is a long poem with the opening lines of "Dies Irae" (Day of Wrath). The poem begins by depicting the chaos of judgement day but ultimately ends in a plea to Jesus to grant rest to those who have gone before us.

IMMIGRANT ARRIVAL UPDATE & NEEDS

As of 10/15/22 about 3,000 immigrants have arrived and more are arriving daily. 10,000 are expected by year end. The most urgent needs: hygiene kits and transportation. For a complete list: www.Chicago.gov/support or it is available at the collection bins near the social hall or church office. Hygiene kit items include: a durable gag to hold items, shampoo, soap, toothbrushes and toothpaste, deodorant, disposable razors and shaving cream, feminine hygiene products, socks, basic first aid supplies, Ibuprofen/Acetaminophen.
