IMMIGRANT ARRIVAL UPDATE & NEEDS

As of 10/15/22 about 3,000 immigrants have arrived and more are arriving daily. 10,000 are expected by year end. The most urgent needs: hygiene kits and transportation. For a complete list: <u>www.Chicago.gov/support</u> or it is available at the collection bins near the social hall or church office. Hygiene kit items include: a durable gag to hold items, shampoo, soap, toothbrushes and toothpaste, deodorant, disposable razors and shaving cream, feminine hygiene products, socks, basic first aid supplies, Ibuprofen/Acetaminophen.
