This support group will meet with the book, "Anxiety: The Missing Stage of Grief" by Claire Bidwell Smith who is a hospice grief counselor. This support group will follow the contents and suggestions of the book to begin the healing process. The book will be in the church office for \$18/copy or you can order it online. Please tell anyone who you think may benefit from this support group. Unaddressed or prolonged grief can cause anxiety, panic attacks, and other emotional hardships.
