YOU CAN ATTEND THE SPECIAL FINANCE COMMITTEE VIA ZOOM

The Boy Scouts of America (BSA) filed for bankruptcy relief in 2020, overwhelmed by lawsuits that grew to involve more than 84,000 allegations of child sexual abuse related to the Boy Scout program as far back as the 1960's. The United Methodist Church became involved because of our long-standing relationship with Scouting troops in our churches. As a result, the UMC committed \$30 million to the Survivor Trust Fund. The amount allocated to Northern Illinois is \$754,348. Now the churches in the Northern Illinois Conference, including the Glenview UMC, are invited to participate in the payout plan. Our Finance Committee met to discuss it and decided to meet again on April 24 (Monday) at 7 pm through Zoom. It is open to all our members who want to share their input or to contribute to the Survivor Trust Fund. Please contact the church office if you want to get the zoom link.

Your contributions will benefit WINGS (Women in Need Growing Stronger). Supportive services provided to WINGS residents include budget planning, counseling, child and family services, support groups, crisis management, goal setting, and access to vocational counseling. WINGS has Emergency Safe Houses in Chicago and the suburbs, Transitional Housing for unemployed survivors and their children with refuge while they seek employment. WINGS apartments are distributed throughout the north and northwest suburbs and Permanent Housing for long-term and optional supportive services to physically or mentally disabled adults and their children. Please bring any size diapers (not adult) and wipes to the bins by the social hall and the church office.
