One pastor I knew for a long time re-evaluated the purpose of her life and ministry during the pandemic, and she decided to go to abroad as a missionary.



Now she is a UMC missionary in Jerusalem. One other pastor moved to Colorado to be a part time pastor, part time hiker and part time writer. Another pastor retired earlier than she planned to be with her aging parent. Sometimes I reflect on my life and ministry since the pandemic reset button came back on. I am changed. Before the pandemic I was busy in the morning preparing myself to go to church, to check the calendar and todo list, driving Tim to school, and trying to balance between work and family. Once the pandemic started, my morning became so quiet outwardly, but anxiety filled inwardly. I developed morning habits of going to the beaches of the Lake Michigan, watching flowers, trees, and birds closely, listening to K-pop music, watching Korean movies and dramas, reading more books, and writing anything other than sermons. I still keep these morning rituals and I am more connected with myself, my roots, and my faith. Now I believe I connect with God and others more freely and authentically.

The pandemic taught me about why church, why worship, and why stay in local church ministry: Christ opened his church to all ages, nations, and races. As Christ intended, we need to stay open; open to the Spirit, open to ourselves, open to strangers, and open to changes. We are invited again and again to participate in his body, the church, through all kinds of changes. I am grateful that we build a body of Christ in this small corner of the world as Glenview United Methodist Church. I believe the pandemic has changed you too. I hope you give yourself a time to reflect on the changes that happened to you, especially, relating to church. If you haven't been in church, why don't you come back with an open mind and attitude? Your church has been changed because you are changed. But it is the same body of Christ. We are called to be the disciples of Jesus Christ. Without you, the church, the Body, is weaker than before. Also, without the church community, we may still believe in God, but we can't be his disciples. Discipleship starts and ends with Jesus' community, and we belong to it together. Thanks be to God.

Carrie in Knott County was the site for their Appalachia Service Project mission trip/ Of course there were stops at Big Boy for breakfast and Miguel's for a pizza lunch on their way. After arriving in Carrie, KY, Lindsay Kleckner, Andrew Duback, Kayt Ribordy, Maddie Peterson, Spencer Peterson, Tim Walters, Linda Kleckner and Beth Peter-

son spent their week working for a family whose home had been damaged by the floods that hit the Appalachian region during the summer of 2022. Repairs made to the home included putting in new floors in two bedrooms, repairing a railing on the front porch steps, removing cabinets and flooring in the kitchen, putting in castle blocks with 4 x 4 supports under the house, installing 6 joists for the kitchen floor and laying down insulation in the kitchen to prepare for the next crew that would install the subfloor. Though ASP is known to be a relationship building ministry with some construction on the side, this group did quite a bit of construction while still making connections with the family and their pets, Burrito the cat and Puppers the dog. We would like to thank our ASP support team: Dave Kleckner, Linda Duback, Eileen Ribordy, Eun-Hye Choi, Chris Walters, Ed Porrett, Susanne Rudolph, Greg Peterson and Bill Murphy who helped us load the vans for departure (including snacks) and clean them up upon return. 

On Sunday, July 23 we celebrated the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.



Update from the GUMC Trustee Committee:

Jane Furch and myself took over the Co-Chairmanship of the GUMC Trustee Committee in August of 2022. Since that time, the trustees committee, facilities manager, Michel Agriopoulos and treasurer, Jim Locke, have made numerous repairs, upgrades and improvements to our church campus. We have a very dedicated committee and their level of detail, commitment and understanding of the church's needs allows for the committee to make informed decisions in a fast-paced manner, with limited resources at our disposal.

I would like to thank the other GUMC committees who have indulged us and cooperated with our suggestions on various issues we needed to resolve here on campus and within GUMC. This was a team effort of highly skilled members within our church who came together to make tough decisions concerning the church and its current and future needs. Our accomplishments make the trustees proud of what has been done in the last 12 months. Some are small, and some are large, but all were needed to make our campus and church, safer, more functional and more business like in how we conduct ourselves. The following is a list of work that has been done (in no particular order):

- 1). toilet repairs (2) to the parsonage (pastor's home)
- 2). electrical repairs to the parsonage
- 3). a new kitchen floor for the parsonage
- 4). a new concrete garage floor to the parsonage to realign the sagging foundation. This corrected the closing and locking of the garage doors.
- 5). new central A/C with upgraded electrical service to the A/C. to the parsonage. The upgrade to 220 service should result in substantial electric bill savings.
- 6). a new fire suppression system for the church kitchen. The system had been out of service since 2020.
- 7). roof repair over the parlor near the men's washroom
- 8). we now require full insurance from all of our shared space partners, along with annual proof of insurance to limit the church's liability.
- 9). a rework of the memorial giving / gift submission form releasing the church from losses and liability while still providing many ways to memorialize loved ones at GUMC.
- 10). reorganized our relationship with the Boy Scouts to limit liability
- 11). we are finalizing a safety plan and emergency plan for the campus and schools
- 12). a new social hall entrance roof and ceiling, along with painted columns. (to be completed soon)
- 13). repaired several security doors at Wesley and Glenview Methodist Preschool (GMPS)
- 14). installed a magnetic security door at sunshine way
- 15). finalizing major boiler repairs and upgrades (to be completed by November 23)
- 16). developed and executed a plan to lock all building doors during school hours which aligns us with the Glenview School District policies
- 17). made numerous lighting improvements and repairs in the rotunda, GMPS and Wesley
- 18). removed abandoned electrical outlets from the rotunda fountain
- 19). added a new french drain on the west side of church office (thanks Curt!)
- 20). collected \$1800.00 in energy fees from GMPS and Wesley
- 21). assisted in the planning and placement of the new GMPS bike track
- 22). several drywall repairs within the church parlor and rotunda
- 23). replaced numerous door closers and locks throughout the building
- 24). participated in the drafting of a security grant from the state of Illinois for the church, GMPS and Wesley. This was awarded to the church and the schools for security upgrades and improvements.

We will be taking a break from meeting for the month of August. We will see you back on the campus in September. We hope you all see what has been accomplished by this very special group of people. We thank the congregation for your faith in us and your generous financial gifts to support these efforts. None of this could have been completed without you!
