"KEEP THE DREAM ALIVE" - UNTED METHODISTS STAND FOR RACIAL JUSTICE

On Aug. 28, 1963 250,000 people assembled in Washington, DC to stand up for civil rights and racial justice. This important day in American history featured stirring music, and inspiring remarks including the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King's unforgettable, "I Have a Dream" speech.

On Sunday, Aug. 27th, the UMC is organizing two back-to-back events in Chicago to honor the 60th anniversary of the March on Washington and to lift up the on-going work of seeking racial justice. At 1:30 pm, there will be a gathering with music and stories at First UMC of Chicago (The Chicago Temple) and at 2:30 pm, there will be a March and Rally for racial justice at Daley Plaza across the street from the Chicago Temple.
