Pursuing these core values, we experienced that mission outreaches, music, and discipleship ministries (including children and youth ministries) overlapped and could create synergies. I deeply appreciate the wonderful works of our leaders and volunteers in these core value areas.

It has been an amazing year for our building and facilities. So many delayed projects have been done, including the new roof of Social Hall entrance, repairing the flat roof, improved security system for the children and teachers whom we house, new air conditioning system and the new garage floor of the parsonage, kitchen fire suspension, a new light pole in the south parking lot, and many many more. I deeply appreciate the time, talents, and gifts that our trustees and volunteers put into these projects.

As the whole world does, our church has experienced many changes and challenges this year. Every change is new as the nature of any change is, and whenever we had setbacks, we wondered where we were and why and how we got there. However, we have trusted God and trusted everyone's love and dedication for the church. We sometimes cried and sometimes laughed together at worship services, committee meetings, fellowship hours, or study groups. We showed ourselves that we were resilient people. This year's average in person worship attendance is 91 and average on-line worship attendance is about 20. These numbers show that we are slowly but steadily recovering from the pandemic. I deeply appreciate any of you who shake visitors' hands, ask their names, show the nursery, the parlor and Sunday School rooms and encourage them to come back.


