Heis Risen!

Friends,

Happy Easter and happy spring! When you receive this newsletter, I believe, we are in Holy Week culminating the season of Lent. When Jesus entered Jerusalem to observe the Passover, people welcomed him with palm branches and shouts of Hosanna. That's our Palm Sunday. There he cleansed the temple by turning over the merchants' tables and kicking out their animals. That evening when Jesus had dinner at Bethany in the house of his friend, Lazarus, his sister Mary anointed him and washed his feet. For a couple of days in Jerusalem Jesus taught people about his coming suffering and death but they didn't believe in him.

On Thursday, the first day of Passover, Jesus had the Last Supper with his disciples and washed their feet even though he knew one of them will sell him out, and all of them will abandon him the next day. That's our Maundy Thursday commemorating his last supper and foot washing. That night he went to the garden of Gethsemane praying until his sweats became blood drops in deep agony. He was arrested that night and brought to the high priest for a trial. From there he was sent to Pilate to be sentenced. The crowd who gathered in the Pilate's court cried "Crucify him!" After beating and mocking him the soldiers of Pilate's court took Jesus to Golgotha and crucified him on Friday morning at about nine o'clock. That's our Good Friday.

He was buried in the tomb which belonged to Joseph of Arimathea and God resurrected him on the third day, Easter. During Holy Week we go from Palm Sunday to Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter following Jesus everywhere he went. We arrive at Easter only when we follow Jesus through his Holy Week journey.







Maundy Thursday Thursday Night 7:00 p.m.



Good Friday

March 29 Friday Night 7:00 p.m.

Friday before Easter. Most solemn day of the church year. Observes the day Jesus was crucified.



Holy Saturday

Saturday before Easter. Observes the day Jesus was in the tomb. This is a day of somber reflection, reflecting on what we'd miss in a world without Jesus.



Easter Sunday

March 31 Sunday Worship 10:00 a.m.

Hallelujah! Christ has risen! This day we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. Sing hallelujahs and celebrate with great joy.
