# CELEBRATION OF HOLY COMMUNION

## Introduction

Beloved children of God, as we gather here this morning, we are the church! It is with the power of Christ that we proclaim that this table is open to all people — no matter who you are or what you believe or what you've been told. Here at the Lord's table, we remember the simple gathering of a chosen family that came together for a meal that proclaimed a new way of being in this world. We remember God's radically inclusive love made real in the life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus. We remember the One who befriended the forgotten, embraced the outcast, and saw the Image of God in all people. We remember the One who confronted every power that disconnected, marginalized, oppressed, and 'other-ed.' It is here at this table that we find hope and imagination to see God's dream and promise of a world of wholeness, and it is here that we receive the nourishment and strength to continue on the paths of justice. Now we join the prayer of confession.

## Confession

Loving God, sometimes we have dishonored ourselves and others in our longing to fit in and to be accepted. At times we have rejected the individuality of others. Sometimes we have allowed the pressure to be popular cause us to bully ourselves and others. Occasionally we

have been silent when we have witnessed people being dishonored because of their truth. Please change our hearts and help us to love our own humanity and the awesomeness of other humans. Please help us forgive ourselves for the harsh things that we have said and thought about ourselves and others. Each person is a unique and beautiful expression of God's divine light and love. We confess that we forget this sometimes and pray that you help us to do better.

# **Assurance of Pardon**

God forgives us of all of our wrongdoings — those we committed consciously and unconsciously. Thank you, God, for your forgiveness. Let us forgive others as God continuously forgives us. Amen

Great Prayer of Thanksgiving God is with us. The Spirit is here. Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise. Always and everywhere, we offer our thanks: for your wonderful love seen in our friends and family; for opening their hearts and hands to the poor; for their hospitality which sought the image of your Son in every welcomed guest. Through them you revealed the way of Mary, the mother of your Son, in passionate service and holiness of life. And so, with the Angels and Archangels, and with the great multitude of the Saints, we sing the hymn of your praise, as without end we acclaim:

# Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory: Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is the One who comes in the Name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!

Gracious God, we recall the death of your Son, Jesus Christ, proclaim his resurrection and ascension, and look for his coming again.

For on the night in which he was betrayed, he took bread and blessed it, and breaking it, gave it to his disciples, saying: 'Take and eat, this is my body given for you. Do this to remember me.' When supper was ended, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, 'This is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, to remember me.'

# Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Send your Spirit upon us, loving God, and upon these gifts of bread and wine: make them for us the body and blood of your Son, make us for others the Body of Christ, your gift to the world. Unite us with your Church in heaven and on earth, as we offer our thanks and praise, our gifts and our lives, all for your glory and Honor.
