We Can Talk Across the Lines with Braver Angels!

Braver Angels will be at GUMC on Sunday, October 20, presenting how we build bridges in families, schools, and workplaces with the people who have different opinions. The presentation will start at 11:15am in the Choir Room.

Braver Angels is a national movement led by volunteer citizens on a mission to depolarize America's culture. They are building a working alliance of liberals, conservatives, and others to bridge the partisan divide for the good of our democratic republic. They work in communities, on college campuses, in the media, and in the halls of political power to raise the profile of polarization as a destructive problem that partisan Americans must solve together.

The Presenter, Chuck Stone, is Braver Angels' State Co-Coordinator for Illinois and adjunct faculty at DePaul University's School for Continuing and Professional Studies. He is retired from law practice in Chicago. Before that he was a reporter for daily newspapers in Texarkana, Texas and Rockford, Illinois. He has taught undergraduates at DePaul University for 30 years, most frequently teaching a course in critical thinking. He lives on the far south side of Chicago with his wife Ellen.

World Communion Sunday

October 6

On World Communion Sunday a guest preacher, Father Dennis C. Callan, will bring us a message on the worldwide Christian communities. He is a member of the Society of the Divine Word (in Techny Towers), an international Roman Catholic Religious Community of nearly 6000 priests and brothers serving the Gospel in 79 countries around the world. Fr. Dennis, a native of Philadelphia, spent 18 years in Taiwan, Republic of China and another 16 years in South Korea before returning to the United States in 2016. During his time in Taiwan, Fr. Dennis held significant roles serving in parish communities, Director for the training of his community's seminarians in the China Province and General Affairs Director at Fu Jen Catholic University. In Korea served migrant workers, taught in seminaries at Seoul Catholic University and Suwon Catholic University, and served as a "contract priest" for the US Army. He also served as the Superior of his community in Korea and as the leader of his community's Religious Superiors in the Asia-Pacific area. Fr. Dennis is presently responsible for the care of Divine Word Missionaries who temporarily come into the United States for various purposes and needs.

Congratulations



Grab the book now and start reading. Discussion will be held at 7:00 p.m. on October 8 in the church parlor.


Even if you haven't read any of the past books, feel free to read this and hop in on the discussion on October 8. Everyone is welcome!

CROP HUNGER WALK - October 6: This year the walk takes place on Sunday, October 6 at Northfield Community Church, 400 Wagner Rd., (Willow & Wagner Rds.) Northfield. All walkers can enjoy a light lunch at noon and then at 1:00 p.m walk any distance up to

5k. You can participate by joining the GUMC team, donating, securing donors, and/or walking. All proceeds are used by Church World Service to provide food, medical care, disaster relief, provide water wells in remote villages, and self-help development for people in need, locally and around the world. 25% of the money raised by Glenbrook Crop Hunger Walk will be distributed to local food pantries and organizations. All loose coins and singles in the offering plates will go to Curt's Café. Curt's Café offers a much needed program for at risk or formerly incarcerated youth. At Curt's they are taught marketable skills and assisted in finding employment.

They support the students by introducing them to four disciplines: life skills, intellectual skills, food service skills, and experiential skills. These taught skills direct the youth on a secure and productive future. It costs more to send a teenager to a correctional institution than it does to put them through Northwestern. For over 10 years they have maintained a 5% recidivism rate while the national average is 85%. Curt's Cafe would love for you to eat in one of their cafes in either Evanston or Highland Park. They serve breakfast and lunch. Why not try both locations? You can also donate by scanning this QR Code and choosing Loose Coins from the options.
