We will meet four times on 10/6, 13, 20 and 27. The discussion will be facilitated by Rev. Monica Isaac, a Deacon in the Northern Illinois Conference, a Licensed Professional Counselor, Marriage and Family Therapist and trained mediator. Discussion will focus on the patterns and psychology of historical leaders with narcissistic and sociopathic tendencies including why they behave the way they do, how we recognize them, and how we can talk about it in a way that affects change.
