of the book by Bill Eddy, Why We Elect Narcissists and Sociopaths - And How We Can Stop! On Sunday mornings in October from 9 - 9:55 am in Pastor Eun-Hye's office. We will meet four times on 10/6, 13, 20 and 27. The discussion will be facilitated by Rev. Monica Isaac, a Deacon in the Northern Illinois Conference, a Licensed Professional Counselor, Marriage and Family Therapist and trained mediator. Discussion will focus on the patterns and psychology of historical leaders with narcissistic and sociopathic tendencies including why they behave the way they do, how we recognize them, and how we can talk about it in a way that affects change. We will be following the reading from the book, but it is not necessary to read the book or to attend every session in order to participate. Curt's Café offers a much needed program for at risk or formerly incarcerated youth. At Curt's they are taught marketable skills and assisted in finding employment. They support the students by introducing them to four disciplines: life skills, intellectual skills, food service skills, and experiential skills. These taught skills direct the youth on a secure and productive future. It costs more to send a teenager to a correctional institution than it does to put them through Northwestern. For over 10 years they have maintained a 5% recidivism rate while the national average is 85%. Curt's Café would love for you to eat in one of their cafes in either Evanston or Highland Park.
