#### LOOSE COINS AND SINGLES IN THE OFFERING PLATES WILL GO TO CURT'S CAFE.

Curt's Café offers a much needed program for at risk or formerly incarcerated youth. At Curt's they are taught marketable skills and assisted in finding employment. They support the students by introducing them to four disciplines: life skills, intellectual skills, food service skills, and experiential skills. These taught skills direct the youth on a secure and productive future. It costs more to send a teenager to a correctional institution than it does to put them through Northwestern. For over 10 years they have maintained a 5% recidivism rate while the national average is 85%. Curt's Café would love for you to eat in one of their cafes in either Evanston or Highland Park.
