# The Great Thanksgiving for Lent

The Lord be with you.

Your contributions will benefit WINGS (Women in Need Growing Stronger). Supportive services provided to WINGS residents include budget planning, counseling, child and family services, support groups, crisis management, goal setting, and access to vocational counseling. WINGS has Emergency Safe Houses in Chicago and the suburbs, Transitional Housing for unemployed survivors and their children with refuge while they seek employment. WINGS apartments are distributed throughout the north and northwest suburbs and Permanent Housing for long-term and optional supportive services to physically or mentally disabled adults and their children. #### LOOSE COINS AND SINGLES IN THE OFFERING PLATES DURING APRIL WILL GO TO LOAVES AND FISHES.

Volunteers from our congregation prepare substantial and nutritious balanced meals and snacks for Youth Services of Glenview/Northbrook. At this time we serve around 50 youth plus their tutor volunteers. We prepare

3-4 meals and 2-3 snacks a year. Also, last year we served a morning snack and lunch for the volunteers at the Midwest Mission packing event at our church. This coming October we will be hosting another food packing event for Midwest Missions. The money you donate helps to provide for these outreach programs.
