Your contributions will benefit WINGS (Women in Need Growing Stronger). Supportive services provided to WINGS residents include budget planning, counseling, child and family services, support groups, crisis management, goal setting, and access to vocational counseling. WINGS has Emergency Safe Houses in Chicago and the suburbs, Transitional Housing for unemployed survivors and their children with refuge while they seek employment. WINGS apartments are distributed throughout the north and northwest suburbs and Permanent Housing for long-term and optional supportive services to physically or mentally disabled adults and their children. Please bring any size diapers (not adult) and wipes to the bins by the social hall and the church office.

LOOSE COINS AND SINGLES IN THE OFFERING PLATES DURING APRIL WILL GO TO THE BISHOP'S APPEAL NORTHERN ILLINOIS CONFERENCE.

The money collected will be donated to two worthy recipients. One beneficiary is for the construction of a high school in Tanzania, a mission site led by a missionary and NI clergy, Rev. Young Seon Kim. The plan is to build a high school which will help young people continue their education and pursue a future that may never be possible. The other beneficiary is an endowment that supports clergy education for the denomination's regions in Africa, Europe and the Philippines. Today fewer than 5% of pastors in the U.S. hold a master's degree in theology. The scholarships will equip a new generation of women and men for pastoral ministry.
